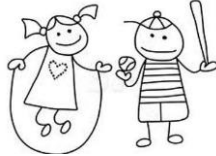

A new Healing Ministry Team

Jesus desires that we live life in all its fullness here and now, (John 10:10), hence the need for on-going spiritual healing. I am not saying we have to be happy all the time, but I am saying that Jesus offers us deep inner peace as a bedrock to our lives. Another core verse that invites spiritual healing is John 8:31: "If you make my word your home you will indeed be my disciples. You will learn the truth and the truth will make you free." It is always Christ who heals and his healing involves the whole person. The fullness of life which is Christ's wish for us is only possible if we are able to accept ourselves as Christ made us and are convinced that we are truly precious in his sight. This is called healing of self-image and is the first step towards the healing of our relationships with others through forgiveness, and the healing of our memories through changing the way in which we remember the past.

There is no question of a special technique: it is simply a matter of willingly and honestly bringing all our past hurts and resentments before Christ and asking him to heal them while giving us the power to forgive. When inner healing does not take place in response to our prayer it is almost always because of a variety of barriers which we place in its way such as lack of self-acceptance or lack of genuine repentance. Our focus is on inner spiritual healing so as to be free to live the fruits of the Holy Spirit. In the presentation called Freedom Work on September 30th, I will discuss in detail five barriers to inner healing which are: lack of self-acceptance, unrepentance, unforgiveness, guilt and shame. To rid ourselves of any of these we need to understand them. Toxic thinking poisons the mind and the heart. Inner spiritual healing is the antidote. We can truly be freed from negative thoughts and restored into the image and likeness of God. Please put the dates and times in your diary and come along to both events, and if you know anyone who needs inner healing please invite them.
